INFORMATION EXCHANGE

No single practitioner can have a full picture of a child's needs and circumstances so multi-agency working and information sharing are essential. Perennial issues around practice have highlighted that missed opportunities to record, understand the significance of, and share information in a timely manner can have severe consequences for children.

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RISK & CRITICAL THINKING

When addressing child abuse and neglect, collective curiosity, critical thinking and analysis are crucial. These skills help us to build an accurate picture of the child's lived experience, assess their situation and identify potential abuse or harm. By questioning assumptions and recognising uncertainty, practitioners can address these challenges effectively.
