Safeguarding Children who are Victims of Domestic Abuse

25 - 29 November 2024

Domestic abuse includes a range of abusive and coercive behaviours. To effectively support both children and adults, statutory and voluntary sector services must have a thorough understanding of how abusers employ controlling and coercive tactics, as well as the fear faced by victims of all ages. It is essential that our professional responses are rooted in a comprehensive knowledge of domestic abuse.

TRAINING

To facilitate our understanding of domestic abuse, HSCP offers a series of 15 domestic abuse-themed webinars designed to aid multi-agency practitioners in Hampshire with their ongoing professional development. These sessions help foster a collaborative safeguarding response for children and young people who are victims/survivors of domestic abuse.

Themes include:

- Impact on children and young people
- Recognising and responding to perpetrators
- Economic abuse
- Stalking and cyber-stalking
- Coercive controlling behaviour
- Male survivors/victims of domestic abuse
- Disability and life limiting illness and domestic abuse
- Risk assessment and the DASH risk indicator checklist
