# DOMESTIC ABUSE

**STOP** 

Domestic abuse is any single incident, course of conduct or pattern of abusive behaviour between individuals aged 16 or over who are "personally connected" to each other as a result of being, or having been, intimate partners or family members, regardless of gender or sexuality. Behaviour is considered "abusive" if it includes any of the following: physical or sexual abuse; violent or threatening behaviour; controlling or coercive behaviour; economic abuse; or psychological, emotional or other abuse. Since the implementation of the <u>Domestic Abuse Act</u> <u>2021</u>, children who see, hear or experience the effects of domestic abuse are now recognised as victims in their own right.
